## OKSCAUG User Group Meetings

In February, OKSCAUG hosted the first User Group Meeting of the year in Edmond. Approximately one hundred people gathered to network and hear presentations from Pamela Journey of Cross Timbers, Scott Highby of Continental Resources, Inc. and Michael Beavers of Esri. Topics ranged from understanding the fluctuating prices of oil and gas to the features of the new ESRI platform.

The next user group meeting is scheduled for June 15 at the National Weather Center on the OU Campus in Norman. Patrick Livingood, Anthropology Professor at OU will be presenting on how he has used GIS to understand the political organization of the Southern Appalachians (1000-1600 CE). Following will be a presentation about Healthy Living Program by Joyce Samuel and Marcia Castellanos-Aymat of the Oklahoma State Department.

Michael Beavers of ESRI will conclude the presentations with discussing the Vector-borne Disease Surveillance and Control Solution.

The third User Group Meeting is scheduled for August 2nd at the Tulsa City Council Chambers. Space is limited to 190 registrants, so be sure to register!

The fourth will be held in Walters, Oklahoma on December 6th. More details to come.

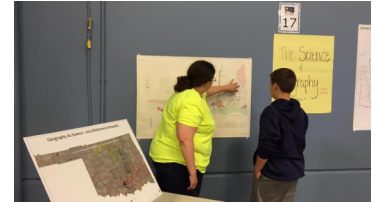
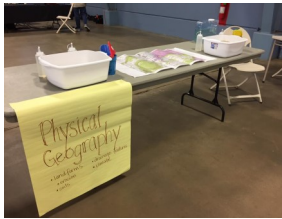
awarded to Joe Porter, Francesco Zignol, and John Fell.

## Map Showcase: OESC's Monthly Unemployment Rate Maps

Each month, Oklahoma Employment Security Commission (OESC) releases both state-level and county-level unemployment statistics from the Bureau of Labor Statistics' Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) program. Along with our news releases, we publish this data in a series of GIS maps using ArcGIS. Highlighting the county-level maps, we depict: 1) current month unemployment rates by county; 2) 12-month average unemployment rates by county; over-the-month percentage point change in unemployment rates by county; and 4) over-the-year percentage point change in unemployment rates by county.

Putting these maps together is fairly straightforward and simply requires joining the monthly county LAUS file to the Oklahoma county map (using county FIPS

codes for the join field). These maps provide greater insight into unemployment trends here in Oklahoma.

These maps are produced by Monty Evans. Monty is a Senior Economist at the Oklahoma Employment Security Commission working in the Labor Market Information (LMI) Group of the Economic Research and Analysis Division. He is responsible for maintaining statewide and national economic indicators, industrial and occupational projections, labor market analysis, and developing department publications.

Monty holds a BA in Psychology and an MA in Economics from the University of Central Oklahoma and has more than 15 years of experience in economic research

and economic development. As a graduate assistant at the University of Central Oklahoma, he helped launch the Center for Urban Economic and Business Analysis. At the Greater Oklahoma City Chamber, he established and managed the Research and Information Services department in the chamber's Economic Development Division. Following his tenure at the chamber, he managed a commercial real estate consulting practice before coming to the Oklahoma Employment Security Commission.
